Re: Response for documents as required

We met at the City of Atlanta Detention Center April 15th and reviewed the requirements for bringing forward sacramental services through the Office of Right Reverend Gregory Karl Davis, there. The sacrament we discussed is termed the 'baptism of repentance' taught by John the baptizer in the Gospels and also referred to in the Acts of the Apostles in the religion of the anointed Ones (Christianity). We also discussed the

policy of discussing the criminal cases of the inmates and was informed by your office to the policy there. You informed this Office that discussing criminal cases with the inmates there at the Atlanta City Detention Center is strictly PROHIBITED. That policy is understood as directed and will not be violated. You directed this Office to document the following after making copies of Clergy ID and US Passport, and the links to those documents are Subsequently noted.

The procedure will be to use City of Atlanta water poured into a 5 gallon bucket brought there for that purpose. This water will be blessed with the Lalibella (thief in the night) bishop hand Cross. Blessing of water is a marvel and is documented as manifesting the Divine by the latest technology of note here.

This blessed water will then be poured over the inmate while standing them over a drain, preferably the shower stall. Then, the right foot will be anointed with the holy anointing oil of Jehovah in conformance to the 'baptism of repentance' taught by John to complete the ceremony with prayer. Each baptized inmate will be issued a 'certificate of baptism'. This certificate will give access to Holy Communion and membership in the Anglican Communion.
